The Family – Living in the Holy Estate of Marriage

This Week's Catechetical Theme: The Family – Living in the Holy Estate of Marriage

Last week we began exploring the vocations of husband and wife, which are given by God in creation as an image—an icon—of Christ and the Church. But this fundamental relationship is so important, and the Scriptures have much to say, so we'll spend another week exploring the holy estate of marriage. Actually, we'll spend this week looking at some passages which describe the calling of husbands and wives who find themselves in marriages that aren't, well, picture perfect. When one spouse happens to fall into sin, or one is an unbeliever, how does a Christian respond? Should he or she remain? Should he or she abandon the relationship? And what if you aren't married, does that mean you're somehow incomplete? God's Word is clear, and although it is not easy, it is our firm foundation, and so we will spend this week exploring what the Bible teaches us about remaining in marriage for better or for worse.

How might this be a good passage to keep in mind when thinking about Christian marriage? Sat: In preparation for Sunday, reflect upon today's texts.
