The Ten Commandments & The Apostles' Creed

On Christian Freedom (Martin Luther)

A Christian is the freest lord of all, subject to none. A Christian is the most dutiful servant of all, subject to all. Although these statements appear to contradict each other, nevertheless, when they are found to agree, they will serve our purpose beautifully. For both are the statements of Paul himself, who says in 1 Corinthians 9[:19], "Though I be free, I have made myself the servant of all"; in Romans 13[:8], "Owe no one anything except that you love one another." Now love is by its own nature dutiful and obedient to that which is loved. Thus even Christ, though Lord of all things, was nevertheless made of woman, made under the Law [Galatians 4:4]. He was at the same time free and a servant, at the same time in the form of God and in the form of a servant (Martin Luther, Christian Freedom, p. 48).
