Holy Gospel*: Matthew 22:1-14

The Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew, the 22nd chapter. **Glory be to Thee, O Lord.**¹ And again Jesus spoke to them in parables, saying, ² "The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a wedding feast for his son, ³ and sent his servants to call those who were invited to the wedding feast, but they would not come. ⁴ Again he sent other servants, saying, 'Tell those who are invited, "See, I have prepared my dinner, my oxen and my fat calves have been slaughtered, and everything is ready. Come to the wedding feast." ⁵ But they paid no attention and went off, one to his farm, another to his business, ⁶ while the rest seized his servants, treated them shamefully, and killed them. ⁷ The king was angry, and he sent his troops and destroyed those murderers and burned their city. ⁸ Then he said to his servants, 'The wedding feast is ready, but those invited were not worthy. ⁹ Go therefore to the main roads and invite to the wedding feast as many as you find.' ¹⁰ And those servants

went out into the roads and gathered all whom they found, both bad and good. So the wedding hall was filled with guests. ¹¹ "But when the king came in to look at the guests, he saw there a man who had no wedding garment. ¹² And he said to him, 'Friend, how did you get in here without a wedding garment?' And he was speechless. ¹³ Then the king said to the attendants, 'Bind him hand and foot and cast him into the outer darkness. In that place there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.' ¹⁴ For many are called, but few are chosen.

Hymn of the Month: The hymn of the month for October is Martin Schelling's (1532-1608) hymn, 'Lord, Thee I Love with All My Heart' (LSB 708). In three stanzas, this hymn gives a complete picture of the Christian life. Stanza 1 acknowledges our need for the Lord's presence and affirms our trust in His saving blood even in the midst of the evil

of this life. In stanza 2, we acknowledge the Lord as the source of all good things and ask for a life that will "glorify Thy lavish grace...and help and serve my neighbor." In stanza 3, we face death unfearing. In fact, we can even welcome it anticipating the joy of being in God's glorious presence. It's just as we sing, "And then from death awaken me, that these mine eyes with joy may see, O Son of God, Thy glorious face, My Savior and my fount of grace..." (Stz. 3). And so in the face of the evils that surround us, this hymn wonderfully confesses the hope and eternal life that we have through Jesus, our Savior and Redeemer. I pray God's richest blessings as you sing and meditate on this hymn in the coming month.
