**CATECHETICAL THEME:**

*The 6<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup> Petitions of the Lord’s Prayer*

**This Week’s Catechetical Theme: The 6<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup> Petitions of the Lord’s Prayer**

Our Catechetical focus is on the 6th & 7th Petitions. About the 6th Petition, “And lead us not into temptation,” Luther writes the following in the Large Catechism: “Temptation...is of three kinds: of the flesh, of the world, and of the devil. For we dwell in the flesh and carry the old Adam about our neck. ...Next comes the world, which offends us in word and deed. It drives us to anger and impatience. ...Then comes the devil, pushing and provoking in all directions. But he especially agitates matters that concern the conscience and spiritual affairs. ...This, then, is what “lead us not into temptation” means. It refers to times when God gives us power and strength to resist the temptation [1 Corinthians 10:13].”

About the 7th Petition, “But deliver us from evil,” Luther writes the following in the Large Catechism: “In the Greek text this petition reads, ‘Deliver or preserve us from the evil one,’ or ‘the hateful one.’ It looks like Jesus was speaking about the devil, like He would summarize every petition in one. So the entire substance of all our prayer is directed against our chief enemy. For it is he who hinders among us everything that we pray for: God’s name or honor, God’s kingdom and will, our daily bread, a cheerful good conscience, and so forth.” So it is that the 6th & 7th Petitions of the Lord's Prayer are the focus of the week’s devotional material. God bless your time in His Word!

**The Catechism:** *6<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup> Petitions of the Lord’s Prayer*

**And lead us not into temptation.** *What does this mean?* God tempts no one. We pray in this petition that God would guard and keep us so that the devil, the world, and our sinful nature may not deceive us or mislead us into false belief, despair, and other great shame and vice. Although we are attacked by these things, we pray that we may finally overcome them and win the victory."

**But deliver us from evil.** *What does this mean?* We pray in this petition, in summary, that our Father in heaven would rescue us from every evil of body and soul, possessions and reputation, and finally, when our last hour comes, give us a blessed end, and graciously take us from this valley of sorrow to Himself in heaven.

### Questions to Discuss in the Home

**Sun:** Reflect upon today's text and sermon. **Mon-Fri.:** Use the following questions to initiate discussion about each day's reading: Does this reading deal with the 6th or 7th Petition? If it deals with the 6th Petition, who is undergoing the trial, from whom is it given, and is this trial a test in order to strengthen or a temptation in order to destroy? If it deals with the 7th Petition, who is suffering evil, to what is the one suffering evil pointed, is the one who suffering evil delivered from it, and if so, from whom does the deliverance come? **Sat:** In preparation for Sunday, reflect upon today's texts.
